#### HIGHLIGHTS FROM OUR CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

#### \$1.5M AWARDED BY THE IRF

The Virginia Industrial Revitalization Fund (IRF) awarded Arcadia Project \$1,500,000 to preserve the charm of the historic theater at 125 E. Beverley Street while creating an adaptive, mixed-use, state-of-the-

We were one of four projects in the state that received funding for construction projects aligned with local and regional economic development strategies.

We are humbled by the contributions of 225 donors who helped us obtain the matching funds needed for a successful application.

#### SALE OF 119 E. BEVERLY ST.

Arcadia Project sold 119 E. Beverley Street, the building adjacent to the theater, to Miller & Associates.

The highly qualified development services provider is developing it into 23 rental apartments with commercial space on the ground level.

This deal created a tremendous winwin situation. The renovation of both historic buildings is significant to the economic vitality of downtown Staunton. And, the proceeds from the sale were used toward the required 1:1 IRF grant match.

#### CONNECTING PEOPLE THROUGH CULTURE AND CREATIVITY



We brought together 3,357 people through 14 programs that fostered creative expression, built understanding, and fostered connections.

Partnerships have been key to providing diverse, creative, educational, and enrichment opportunities for the central Shenandoah Valley.

We enjoyed co-creating gatherings with Staunton Jams, Mary Baldwin University's Shakespeare and Performance graduate program, Queen City Women's Day, and Creative Mornings (pictured above). In addition, The Milestones and Austin Fox recorded music videos in our building and our windows spotlighted art from Ft. Defiance High School, Wilson Memorial High School, Mary Baldwin University, and the Shenandoah Green Student Earth Day Contest.

#### TRIWIZARD MAZE AT QCMM



During Queen City Mischief and Magic, 3,000 people braved the rain to find their way through our Triwizard Tourny Maze which featured a sculpture of a baby dragon made in partnership with LAUNCH. The event inspired imagination as we increased participation by 57% from 2022 and raised \$14,456.

#### **MUSIC AT THE MOVIES**



This fall our monthly series in partnership with Visulite Theater was a great success. We brought together three local musicians with great films about music. Maria Leckey hosted Anonymous Club, Mallory McKendry hosted *The 40* Year Old Version, and MoJo Parker hosted *Crossroads*. Each inspired new ideas and encouraged participants to find common ground.

2019: We raised \$70,000 from 38 local "Freedom Circle" donors and retired the debt on this building with generous support from

2020 - 2022: We improved the façade, renovated the marquee, replaced the rear roof, remediated asbestos, cleared the interior, and completed engineering and architectural plans. 2023: We raised \$2.3M, including \$1.5M from Virginia's Industrial

Atlantic Union Bank.

Revitalization Fund, to preserve the historic charm of the theater while providing a modern cultural center and gathering space.

Construction will begin. Help us fund the fixtures and furnishings 2024 needed to meet community-identified interests. With your contribution, we can open our doors without debt.
